### 4. Selection of Participants and Grouping:

If the number of applicants exceeds 15, we may need to select participants by giving the first priority to GSID M1 students, and then determine the rest by examining the reasons for application written in the application form.

If the number of M1 applicants already exceeds 15, the participants will be selected in the same manner. Grouping will be made in consideration to the applicant's preference for a particular working group as expressed in the application form. However, not all may be allocated to the group of their first choice. The final decision for grouping rests with the DFW Committee.

5. Participation fee: To be announced by May 8, 2015.

#### 6. Insurance:

As part of formal curriculum of GSID, participants for DFW are required to purchase Personal Accident Insurance for Students (PAS) Pursuing Education and Research and Liability Insurance coupled with PAS.
