

Guideline on Application for Campus ASEAN Short-term Overseas Study Program (2013)

(Nagoya University - Chulalongkorn University)

1. Background and Objectives

The Graduate School of International Development (GSID), Nagoya University introduces a Re-Inventing Japan Project titled “Training a New Generation of Leaders in International Cooperation for the Development of the ASEAN Region” (Campus ASEAN in short) for the period of school year 2012 through 2016. This project, which was jointly applied by GSID, Graduate School of Law/ School of Law, Graduate School of Economics/ School of Economics, Center for Asian Legal Exchange (CALE) and International Cooperation Center for Agricultural Education, was adopted and supported by Japan Society for the Promotion of Science (JSPS). The main objective of this project is to foster global leaders in international cooperation who understand both aid and business, with knowledge of economy, law, politics, society and culture of the ASEAN region and Japan. For this purpose, Nagoya University has established a consortium with National University of Singapore, Chulalongkorn University (Thailand), University of the Philippines Los Banos, Gadjah Mada University (Indonesia), Royal University of Law and Economics (Cambodia), Hanoi Law University (Vietnam) and Ho Chi Minh City University of Law (Vietnam) to develop common curriculum with quality assurance and strengthen participants’ mutual understanding through short-term and long-term overseas studies.

As part of the program, GSID is going to host short-term overseas study for students from Chulalongkorn University (Thailand) in school year 2013 (Fall Semester). Students involved in this short-term program are expected to be inspired to become a future leader in international cooperation and improve their intercultural understanding through lectures and cultural tours during their stay in Japan.

2. Period and Duration

Period: Oct.7- Oct.13, 2003

Duration: Seven days

3. Host Institution

Graduate School of International Development (GSID), Nagoya University, Japan

4. Activities

Lectures in morning sessions and Fieldworks* in afternoon sessions

*Fieldworks may include Toyota, Denso, Brother, MORISEIKI.

5. Coverage of Financial Support

Campus ASEAN Short-term Overseas Study Program provides financial support for participants recommended by Chulalongkorn University. The details of the coverage of financial supports are as below.

A. Air ticket

Nagoya University provides a round-trip economy class air ticket (including airport tax and fuel surcharge) from international airports nearest Bangkok to Chubu Centrair International Airport, Nagoya. Our designated travel agency will arrange the flight for the participant.

B. Other costs are not covered.

6. Accommodation

In principle, Campus ASEAN Program is responsible for securing suitable in-campus or off-campus accommodation for participants. Participants shall be responsible for the cost of their accommodation (as per 5.B). For Short-term Overseas Study Program 2013, the cost of the accommodation will be subsidized by special arrangement by GSID.

9. Supplementary Explanation

A) Airport Pick-up service

On the day of arrival, Nagoya University does not provide pick-up service. We will try to arrange people to guide participants from Central Japan International Airport to accommodation within Nagoya University. Nagoya University covers the cost for hiring the guide. In case we cannot arrange the guide, we will provide information about the access from Central Japan International Airport to accommodation within Nagoya University in details in advance. Participants from Chulalongkorn University go to accommodation from Central Japan International Airport by themselves.
