

Campus ASEAN Short-term Overseas Study Program (2015) **(Nagoya University - Royal University of Law and Economics, Cambodia)**

1. Background and Objectives

The Graduate School of International Development (GSID), Nagoya University introduces a Re-Inventing Japan Project titled “Training a New Generation of Leaders in International Cooperation for the Development of the ASEAN Region” (Campus ASEAN in short) for the period of school year 2012 through 2016. This project, which was jointly applied by GSID, Graduate School of Law/School of Law, Graduate School of Economics/School of Economics, Center for Asian Legal Exchange (CALE) and International Cooperation Center for Agricultural Education, was adopted and supported by Japan Society for the Promotion of Science (JSPS). The main objective of this project is to foster global leaders in international cooperation who understand both aid and business, with knowledge of economy, law, politics, society and culture of the ASEAN region and Japan. For this purpose, Nagoya University has established a consortium with National University of Singapore, Chulalongkorn University (Thailand), University of the Philippines Los Baños, Gadjah Mada University (Indonesia), Royal University of Law and Economics (Cambodia), Hanoi Law University (Vietnam) and Ho Chi Minh City University of Law (Vietnam) to develop common curriculum with quality assurance and strengthen participants’ mutual understanding through short-term and long-term overseas studies.

As part of the program, GSID is going to host short-term overseas study for **eight students** from Royal University of Law and Economics, Cambodia (Hereafter, RULE) in school year 2015 (Fall Semester). Students involved in this short-term program are expected to be inspired to become a future leader in international cooperation and improve their intercultural understanding through lectures and cultural tours during their stay in Japan.

5. Coverage of Financial Support

Campus ASEAN Short-term Overseas Study Program provides selected participants from RULE scholarship by JASSO (Japan Student Services Organization) for Student Exchange Support Program (For details, please refer to appendix). Applicants who can meet the required qualifications for this scholarship may have the possibility to get additional subsidy to cover cost during your stay in Nagoya. Applicants who plan to apply the scholarship above should submit the required documents to GSID (Please refer to 7 ** in below for details). GSID will be in charge of the application procedure. Other costs are not covered.

6. Accommodation

In principle, Campus ASEAN Program is responsible for securing suitable in-campus or off-campus accommodation for participants. Participants shall be responsible for the cost of their accommodation (as per 5).

9. Supplementary Explanation

A) Airport Pick-up service

On the day of arrival, Nagoya University does not provide pick-up service. We will try to arrange people to guide participants from Central Japan International Airport to accommodation within Nagoya University. Nagoya University covers the cost for hiring the guide. Participants from RULE go to accommodation from Central Japan International Airport by themselves.

Scholarship by JASSO (Japan Student Services Organization) for Student Exchange Support Program (Short-term Study in Japan) (FY 2015)

JASSO offers this scholarship for qualified international students who are accepted by a Japanese university, graduate school, junior college, college of technology (3rd grade or upper) or professional training college (hereafter referred to “Japanese schools”) under a student exchange agreement or other student exchange arrangement on a short-term basis from 8 days to one year between Japanese school and their home higher educational institution outside Japan (hereafter referred to “attending schools”)

The candidates of the long-term overseas study program under Campus ASEAN program, who can satisfy the conditions below, are eligible for the scholarship offered by JASSO.

A) Qualification and contents of scholarship (FY2015)

Qualification and conditions

- i. Students who have excellent academic and personal records at their attending school. Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 2.30* in the previous academic year (Please find the evaluation scale below). If the academic record of previous academic year is not available at the time of application, applicants have to submit the academic record of previous academic semester for evaluation. In addition, if it is impossible to show the GPA, the applicants need to submit relevant documents which demonstrate the excellent academic records of the applicants.

* GPA 2.00-2.30 is also able to apply with a self-recommendation letter.
